- Relationships of atmospheric pressure and wind.
- Determining the path and speed of squalls.
- Strong wind systems found in the Northwest and offshore; how to avoid them.
- Key features of low-pressure systems.
- How 500mb wind patterns can help you find "weather windows" for safe passages.
- How pressure gradients affect wind in Washington waters.
- What is a computer model? How do they work and what can they give you?
- How to get NWS and associated weather, forecast and model data on your computer.
