Bellingham's inaugural celebration of seafood and the fishing life features workshops, seafood and fun

Seattle/Bellingham — Savor the seafood and fishing culture surrounding the Bellingham region at the inaugural Bellingham SeaFeast 2016, the setting for seafood contests, sea rescue demonstrations, fishing workshops, sea shanties and fresh food fare from the surrounding bay and straits.

Bellingham Seafeast 2016 is two full days of everything maritime in your own backyard. Experience the maritime world: learn to fillet a fish, mend a net, sing a sea shanty, and learn local fishing history, meet fishermen poets, taste fresh grilled salmon and watch a helicopter rescue in the bay.

"Fishing is fundamental to Pacific Northwest culture," says Penny Dalton, the director of Washington Sea Grant, a Gold Sponsor for the event. "And it's still vital to our economy.
