Troy Wakefield, fishermen of California presented a lane change request near Crescent City, California. See PDF for presentation.

Q1: Identified the change but what does this do to the crab fishery?

A1: Letters of support from crab industry with letters of support. Was satisfied with the letters of support.

Comment 1: Concerned with the voters and who has skin in the game.

Proposed primary vote via poll inclusive of fisherman and tow boat operators as valid voters. 7 yes and 0 no votes

Comment 2: We need more fishermen and affected people to make reasonable changes.

Comment 3: On fairway proposal, it was a mutual agreement in talking with the Coast Guard on the Fairways. Positive outcomes from the crab fairways for both industries. Response 3: We need to get more involvement in locals and gov agencies in CA. WSG will connect Troy and California Sea Grant and Coast Guard has offered contacts.

WSG will draft up voting rules and share via email. WSG will share primary vote response with active CA tug/tow companies (Sause and Brusco) as well as CA USCG.
