Q1: Why the decline in catch in the northern area?

A1: No clear understanding, lots of sea otters, food range, and toxic events.

Electronic Monitoring - overlay of pots fished and towlanes. Data share agreements may prohibit some sharing of pot locations. Some proactive monitoring and notification for fishers who are in tow lanes.
