<u>Learn How to Keep Your Outboard Motor in Top Condition at This</u> <u>Washington Sea Grant Workshop</u>

Outboard motors are essential for work, fun, safety, and survival on the water. Failing to maintain them can be both dangerous and expensive. That's why <u>Washington Sea Grant</u> and the <u>Northwest Maritime Center</u>, <u>Jefferson Education Center</u>, and <u>WSU Jefferson County Extension</u> are co-sponsoring an Outboard Engine Maintenance Workshop this February in Port Townsend, for boaters who want to keep their motors working for them.

WHAT: OUTBOARD ENGINE MAINTENANCE WORKSHOP. Learn the basics of

maintaining small outboard motors, including fueling, lubrication, electrical inspection, changing oil, and diagnosing common problems. The workshop will focus on both two- and four-cycle gasoline engines, 15-horsepower and smaller, using actual

motors for demonstration.

Stewart Pugh has taught outboard engine repair for 12 years at the Northwest Outdoor Center, while maintaining a fleet of outboards and the schooner

Adventurous.
